A Note FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Saints of Grace:



As we move into a new Church Year, beginning with the First Sunday in Advent, which this year falls on November 27, we are reminded of beginnings and endings. It is fitting that December includes our anniversary as a congregation (63 YEARS!). All those years ago, our Charter Members, very few of whom are still among us, had a vision of a new congregation, centered in Word and Sacrament and with Social Ministry as part of the congregation's DNA. Excellent worship and active participation in Church and Society were the hallmarks of the Augustana Synod, which was our original denomination. Through

the years, the Augustana Synod (including Grace) became a part of the Lutheran Church in America (LCA) which in 1988 became a part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Throughout the decades and throughout the mergers, the "old Augustana" tradition of worship linked with community service was carried on.

Remembering and celebrating our past also gives us a great opportunity to look at our present church life and gaze into the future. Grace today is not the church it was 60, 45, 30 or 15 years ago. In each era we have changed to meet new circumstance and new challenges. And, we have always maintained our center in worship which leads directly to active engagement in the world around us.

And, that tradition continues. As we (hopefully!) emerge from the Covid 19 Pandemic, our in-person worship attendance has continued to grow. We are almost back to prepandemic worship attendance; when you include folks who join us by Zoom, I think we are there! And, through thick and thin, our congregation's response to social needs at home and around the world is still noteworthy!

In December we will have several opportunities to affirm and celebrate the best of Grace, past, present and future.

On Wednesday, December 14, at 7:30pm, we will gather (in person and by Zoom) for **Advent Evening Prayer** featuring the Grace Choir. Take time out during the rush of this season to breath; to sense God's presence among us; to feel the comfort of Christian fellowship.

On the **Third Thursday** (December 15) EVERYONE is invited to our Christmas Luncheon beginning with social time at 11:30 followed by dinner served by Kathie Bender Schwich and me along with contributions from other members. A free will offering will be received to support our local food pantries. We will be serenaded by a barbershop quartet featuring our own Jules Kasten. There will also be games and prizes. On Wednesday, December 21, at 6:00pm we are all invited to attend the 50th (almost annual) **Grace Preschool Christmas Program**. Come and delight in the music of our

Council Highlights from the October 25 meeting

- Council November meeting moved to November 29
- Council December meeting moved to January 10. Discussion will be limited to the budget and nominating committee recommendations
- January 24 will be regular Council meeting.
- Annual Congregational meeting will be held February 5 after the Sunday Church service.
- Approved \$1125 to replace faucets in the north bathrooms and small bath in the preschool with touchless faucets
- Approved the paving by the park district of the bicycle rut which connects our parking lot to their bike path.
- Park District asked to move their paper recycling bin to our parking lot. This matter was tabled for further study.
- Green plants will be placed in the sanctuary after the Christmas season. The plants are being purchased and maintained by Pastor Schwick.
- Approved the concept to have T-Shirts and sweat shirts with Grace logo. These will be offered to the congregation at cost.
- December 18 will be the Cookie Walk
